



## Local stakeholder April – May 2016

We have outlined below progress with the works on site in April, and a look ahead to the works that are due to take place during May.

### APRIL

- The Recyclables Bulking Facility opened, this is now handling recyclables from community recycling centres and also general waste, sweeper waste and food waste collected by the local boroughs.
- The old transfer station building was removed to make way for the Gasification Facility.
- Work began to clad the Anaerobic Digestion Facility tanks with grey steel.
- Work continued on:
  - Testing the Anaerobic Digestion Facility tanks for any leakage by filling them with water.
  - The walls and ground slabs for the Anaerobic Digestion Facility building.
  - The perimeter road to the north and east of the site.
  - The new exit road for the Community Recycling Centre.
  - The Reuse Facility.
  - Preparing the new Community Recycling Centre office.

### MAY

- Solar cells will be installed on the roof of the Recyclables Bulking Facility.
- The foundations of the old transfer station building will be removed, crushed and recycled for use as a piling mat.
- Work will begin on the foundations for the new Gasification Facility, with piling work due to start in late May. Residents nearest the site will be notified in advance by letter.
- Work will begin on the steel frame for the Anaerobic Digestion Facility building.
- The Reuse Facility is due to be completed.
- Work will continue on:
  - Testing and cladding the Anaerobic Digestion Facility tanks.
  - The perimeter road to the north and east of the site.
  - Preparing the new Community Recycling Centre office.
- The metal fence separating the Community Recycling Centre from the working area will be replaced by wood hoarding. The layout of the Community Recycling Centre will continue to be restricted; there are fewer parking spaces available and the site is accepting the full range of materials, with a reduced number of containers. As a result, waiting times are affected, particularly at busy times. Staff are working to minimise disruption and will be on hand to assist site users.
